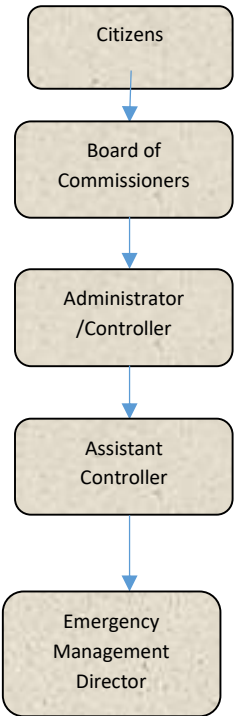


Emergency Management



Activities

Emergency management is concerned with protecting the people and properties of Jackson County.

The division continues to work with the public safety community and public health community, along with local critical infrastructure and key resources to mitigate, prepare, respond and recover from potential disasters.



Strategic Plan Impact

✓ **Safe Community**

Working with the Department of Homeland Security and the Michigan State Police Emergency Management Division, it is the goal of Emergency Management to make Jackson a safer community utilizing an all-hazards approach in dealing with potential disasters.

Accomplishments

- Jackson County Hazard Mitigation Plan received FEMA approval and is valid for 5 years.
- Jackson County Emergency Action Guidelines were updated and distributed to key stakeholders.
- Completion of critical infrastructure assessment of the Jackson County Tower Building in partnership with MSP Critical Infrastructure Protection Specialists.
- Jackson County Emergency Management was an instrumental component during the Covid-19 Pandemic. Through leadership and motivation, the Emergency Management Office procured many needed resources to keep our community safe and allowed for First Responder Agencies to be adequately protected. These PPE requests continued being fulfilled by OEM as local cases increased.

- Jackson County OEM introduced the MSP STEP (Student Tools for Emergency Preparedness) program to local elementary schools.
- Jackson County received \$22,958.54 (FY2021), \$30,210.14 (FY2022) and \$40,355.62 (FY2023) from the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)
- Jackson County received \$22,617.00 from the 2023 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) and \$9,350.00 from the 2023 EMPG American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
- Jackson County received \$1,500.00 from the 2023 Hazardous Materials Emergency Planning Grant (HMEP)

Jackson County OEM participated in several Regional and Local exercises and Trainings in -2023.

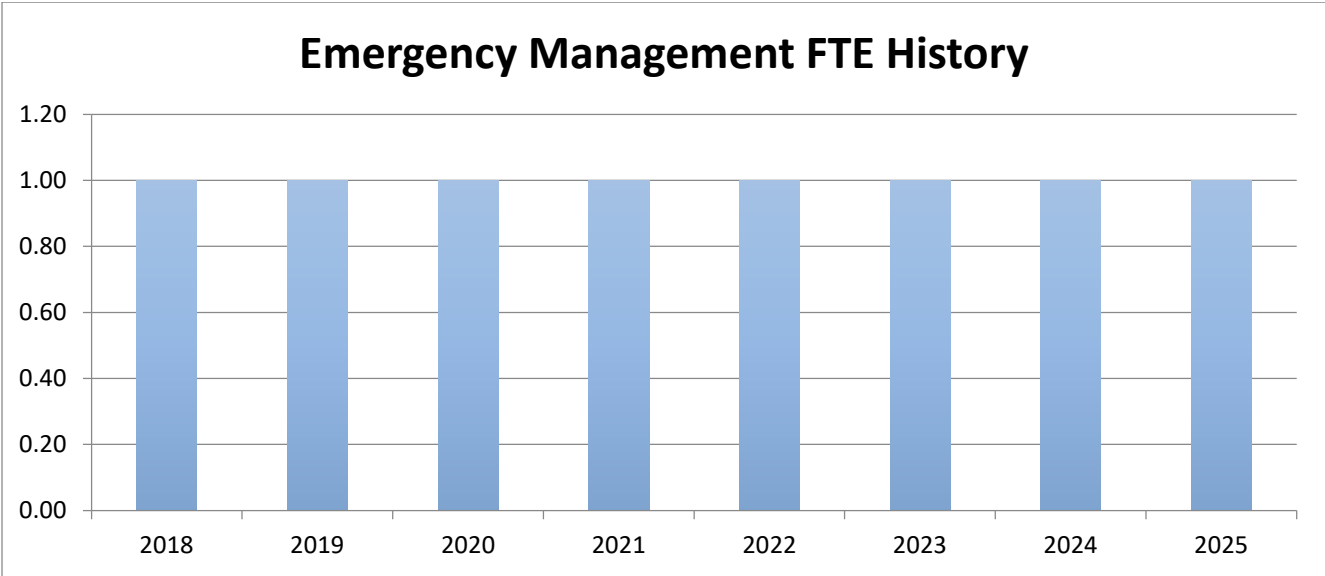
- Jackson County OEM participated in several local, regional and state exercises.
- Jackson County participated in the Statewide Tornado Drill and Severe Weather Preparedness week in March.
- Jackson County OEM hosted multi-agency Terrorist Chemical Tabletop Exercise, Terrorist Related Chlorine Leak Tabletop Exercise along with Jackson County EOC Staff Orientation Exercise
- Jackson County OEM organized After Action Review meetings for real events that occurred, including the Jackson Public Schools Swatting Call and the Hamilton Street Commercial Building Fire.
- Jackson County OEM hosted a multi-scenario tabletop exercise for Jackson County Fair and Keeley Park staff.
- Jackson County OEM completed a comprehensive report identifying critical infrastructure and key resources (CIKR) locations throughout Jackson County.
- Private sector business emergency and safety plans were reviewed and assessed by Jackson County OEM

Emergency Management

- Off-site response plans and Tier II reports were updated for all Hazardous Materials sites within Jackson County.
- Jackson County OEM met with local school districts to review and update their Emergency Response Plans
- Jackson County OEM updated local support plans for communities with a population of 10,000 or more as required by Mi.PA.390.
- Emergency Mass notifications were sent out 53 times during 2023 for missing children, endangered missing adults, lockdown events, traffic crash roadway closures, situational awareness and life safety events. 48 notifications were sent for weather warnings.

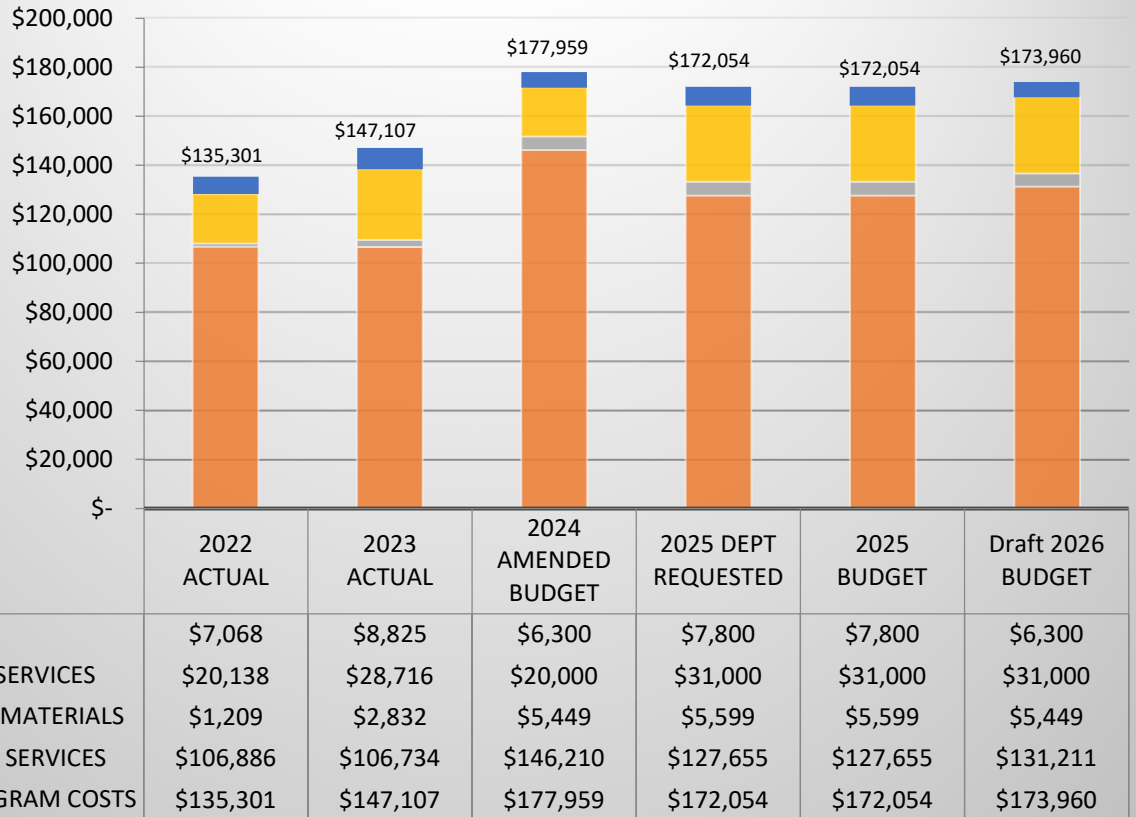
Budget Adjustments
