

SUPPORT DEBT TYPES
THE JACKSON COUNTY FRIEND OF THE COURT
WILL AND DOES NOT ENFORCE

1. Following are the **support and/or related debt types** the Friend of the Court can enter into the Michigan Child Support Enforcement System (**MICSES**). Any debt type not listed below cannot be entered into MICSES.

AF – Attorney Fees
BD – Genetic Test Costs Paid to County
BL – Genetic Test Costs Paid to State
BW – Bench Warrant/Court Costs
CC – Child Care
CS – Child Support
ED – Educational Costs Paid to Custodial Parent (CP)
MD – Medicaid/Confinement
MR – Medical Reimbursement Paid to CP
MS – Medical Support – Client
OS – Out-of-State/Michigan is Responding State
PB – Payee Bonus
PC – Payee Confinement
PF – Processing Fees
RB – Recovery – Bank Adjustment
RD – Recovery – MISDU Make Whole
RM – Recovery – Misapplied (Unique to Wayne County)
RS – Recovery – State Make Whole
RT – Recovery – Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Tax Adjustments
SF – Service Fees
SS – Spousal Support
WF – County Foster Care

2. Following are the support debt types and/or other support obligations the Friend of the Court **WILL** enforce:
- A. Any debt type listed in #1 above, if payable through Friend of the Court or Michigan State Disbursement Unit (MISDU)
 - B. Child health care insurance coverage provisions
 - C. Child medical bills
 - D. Any court ordered support provision that states that the Friend of the Court must enforce the provision, even if it relates to an unusual debt type or an issue listed in #3 below.

3. Following are the debt types and/or other support obligations the Friend of the Court **DOES NOT** enforce:

While the Friend of the Court does NOT enforce the issues listed below, either party has the right to file a motion with the Court, if they wish to have the Court address these issues. Motions can be filed through an attorney or in pro per (party files motion on his/her own). If a party wants to file an in pro per motion, forms and instructions are available at the Friend of the Court office.

- A. Any debt type listed in #1 above, if NOT payable through Friend of the Court or MISDU (i.e., orders that require non-custodial parent to pay ½ of school supplies, ½ of tuition, clothing costs, etc.)
- B. Direct pay order (i.e., one party pays other party directly, not through Friend of the Court or MISDU)
- C. Genetic tests owed to individuals
- D. House payments
- E. Life insurance provisions, even if for benefit of children
- F. Miscellaneous or non-specific debt types
- G. Opt out order cases
- H. Property settlements
- I. Supplemental Security Income (SSI) cases (i.e., non-custodial parent is receiving SSI)
- J. Tax filing violations
- K. Transfer fees
