Jackson County Animal Shelter Millage

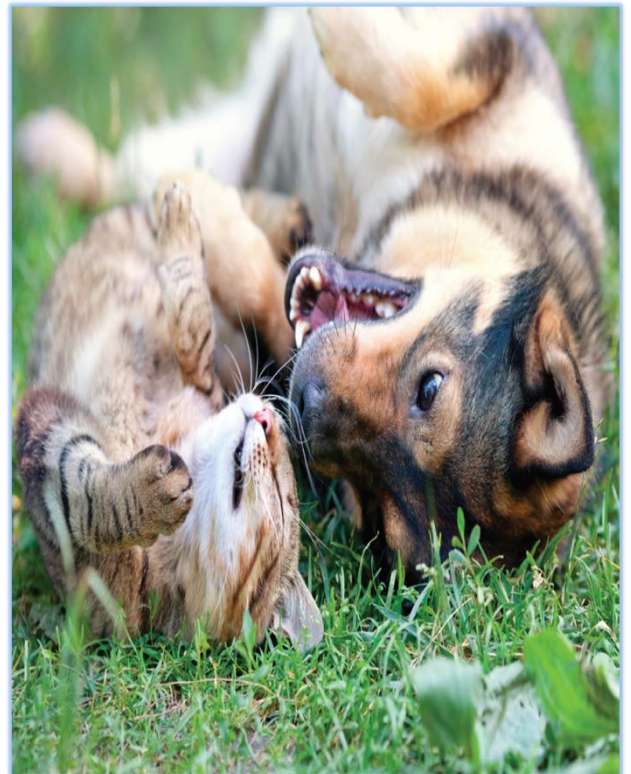

What is the millage?

The millage proposal will establish a stable, long-term funding source for the animal shelter to ensure health, welfare, and safety of staff, animals, and county residents.

How will the millage funds be invested?

- ❖ Restore Animal Control Officers, a full-time Animal Shelter Operations Manager, and allow Jackson County to right size the staff needed to adequately care for the animals.
- ❖ Make safety and capital improvements to the shelter, such as installing a generator for back up energy source, parking lot repairs, ventilation improvements and roof replacement.



Why do we need the improvements?



- ❖ In 2017, the Jackson County Animal Shelter took in 1,076 dogs and 1,221 cats that otherwise might have been left on the streets. To continue caring for animals in need, proper full-time staff is needed.
- ❖ Improve health, safety and welfare of residents and animals by restoring Animal Control Officer Positions.
- ❖ Facility improvements are needed so workers, animals and visitors can safely and comfortably use the shelter.

How much would it cost?

The millage proposal is for \$0.25 mills over a 10 year term. The annual cost to a property with a value of \$100,000 would be \$12.50 annually.
