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JACKSON COUNTY, MI – The Jackson County Health Department’s Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP) is a free, in home service to women and children in the Jackson community. You may be eligible for this service if you are pregnant or have an infant under a year old.

The Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP) services include:

- Maternal and infant health assessment completed by nurse or social worker;
- Registered nurse, licensed social worker and registered dietician team development of care plans;
- Coordination of MIHP services with the beneficiary's medical care provider and Medicaid Health Plan (who assist and supplement that care);
- Registered nurse, licensed social worker, and registered dietitian conduct home or office visits provided with interventions based on the plan of care;
- Transportation services arranged if needed;
- Referrals to local community services (e.g., mental health, substance abuse, domestic violence, basic needs assistance) as needed; and
- Referral to local childbirth education or parenting classes.
