Children's Special Health Care Services

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JACKSON COUNTY, MI February, 2020 – Did you know that Congenital Heart Defects are the most common type of birth defect? Nearly 1 in every 110 babies born in the United States are born with this type of defect. Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week celebrated February 7-11, 2020, reminds us about the ways that we can support children and families who are facing the struggles of living with these types of heart conditions.

Many forms of Congenital Heart Defects require surgery and may require lifelong medical care. The Jackson County Health Department's Children's Special Health Care Services team provides help for families who have children living with many special health conditions, including some related to Congenital Heart Defects.

"Families are often faced with balancing many different needs when caring for a child with special health care conditions. The Children's Special Health Care Services team works closely with families to help remove barriers that may prevent individuals from achieving their health care goals," explains Ann Sloan, LMSW, Community Health Coordinator.

If you have a child with a severe or chronic health condition, sometimes paying for medical care can be a challenge, even if you have insurance. This state program can help qualifying families to pay for specialty medical bills, including some co-pays and deductibles. Children's Special Health Care services also helps to provide referrals for specialty services, along with care coordination, case management, and assistance with transportation to medical appointments for children and some adults having certain disabilities or chronic illnesses.
